Community Service Linden

The object of this award is to recognize the club which best promotes the concept of service by every member of the club in their personal, business and community life.

Club Service Salem

The object of this award is to help the members get to know each other and their respective professions, foster the Family of Rotary and develop activities which advance the Object of Rotary which is to do good in the world.

Public Image Frederick County
